(A bank thermometer in Cordell said 103° Monday afternoon.) Then there was the storm Wednesday night! Quite a few of us got our tents flattened for us, thanks to the high wind that preceded the rain and hail. That might not have been too bad for us, except that Patsy and I were in ours when it collapsed. So Thursday morning, after looking at our broken tent, wet bedding, and my sunburn, I wimped out and we went home.

Don't forget the Firecracker Century on July 5. We normally have this ride on the 4th, but since the 4th falls on Sunday this year, we've moved it to Monday the 5th. We'll leave Johnstone Park at 6:30 a.m. and hopefully get to Tulsa before the wind picks up. We'll rest a bit at Mohawk Park and then start back for Bartlesville with the wind at our backs.

# Through the middle of nowhere... by Thomas Martin

Four hundred miles, seven days and burning asphalt – that's Oklahoma Freewheel! Being an exchange student from Germany, I did the trip this year that took us very far in the west of our beloved Soooner State.

Since I had no bike and no gear (why would you bring that over as an exchange student?), I very much appreciated the support given to me by the Bartlesville Pedalers. Thanks especially to Joel and Shirley Martin, Joanne and Bill Estes, Rod Harwood, and my host dad John Fusselman (who was unable to attend the ride).

The ride officially started Sunday, June 13th in Duncan, OK, although we were there one day earlier and had a short ride from the Texas border (so we could claim to have crossed the state). The ride led us from Duncan to Anthony, KS where we arrived June 19th.

On the way we stopped and stayed over night in the towns of Apache, Cordell, Cheyenne, Thomas, Fairview and Cherokee. Food, campgrounds (outdoor

and indoor) and entertainment were provided at every town. Water stops, fruit stops and lunch stops were provided during the rides.

While it rained the last day, most of the days could be described as blazing hot. There are not many hills in western Oklahoma, but on the ride to Thomas, many of the riders could be heard saying, "Those darn hills, they're never gonna end."

They did end, but it was tough. Speaking of Thomas, I have to mention a "little incident." We were hit by a huge storm, no tornado, but 70- to 80-mile per hour straight winds. Since tents are not really made for this, many of them collapsed (mine didn't, but it blew out all of the stakes. My neighbors came over in the middle of the night and said, "Hey, Thomas our tent collapsed, we're moving to the gym to take shelter, you wanna come, too?" I looked around my tent and since the rain fly was almost gone, the inside looked more like a lake than like my tent.

Well you know what my decision was – I spent the rest of the night in the gym. Despite some complications, it was a wonderful ride. I and all of the other riders have seen Oklahoma in a way not many Oklahomans have seen it – on two wheels and without worrying about gas prices.

Ed. Note: We got to know Thomas on training rides. He saw the article about Freewheel in the Bartlesville newspaper and decided to do Freewheel. He was a senior this year at Dewey High School and swam with the ConocoPhillips team! He is from eastern Germany and enjoys riding a mountain bike and martial arts.

July 31st will be "Pancakes in Pawhuska!"




