Announcing... Another Weekend at the Frisco Superdrome 15-16 December 2001

For all of you who missed it the October clinic, we have scheduled another session at the Superdrome bicycle track in Frisco, Texas. Our adopted track coach, Ryan Crissey, has agreed to do another rider qualification course over the weekend of 15-16 December 2001.

On Saturday afternoon, starting at noon, Ryan will put riders through a one-afternoon condensed

version of the 8 week,16 session rider qualification course offered at the track. The training will include exclusive use of the facilities and its fleet of 50 track bikes. He'll cover basic track riding technique, equipment, protocol, safety, racing events. On Sunday, he'll run us through some racing events as further training for as long as we can pedal! You'll come away with USCF Cat 4 track certification and become eligible for any future Superdrome races and training sessions. All this for a mere \$25 fee!

Already-qualified riders are welcome to join the sessions for practice and reinforcement. You'll be able to ride during the Saturday afternoon class session, and to participate in the Sunday morning racing, at no charge.

This clinic is NOT restricted to Wheelmen members. Any rider with some group riding or racing experience is welcome. This is a great opportunity for anyone interested in trying out track riding. Ryan does a superb job of easing riders into feeling comfortable in the track environment. Mark you calendar, gather up your riding gear, including pedals and shoes (track bikes provided by the Superdrome), and join us for a weekend romp in Frisco.

The Superdrome is located at 9700 Wade Blvd., Frisco, Texas (about 25 miles north of Dallas) on the campus of Collin County Community College. More information and directions are available at the website: www.superdrome.com. There is a Holiday Inn Express nearby the track (4220 Preston Rd., Frisco, 972-668-9400) that provides reasonable accommodations for overnight Saturday.

If you plan to participate, please let me know ahead of time so that I can let Ryan know how many to expect. Contact me if you have further questions.
