# A Report on Quartz Mountain Fall Bike Fest October 12, 13 & 14 Quartz Mountain State Park

If you've never been there, the terrain is pancake flat with a few rolling hills thrown in for good measure. The mountains are not of the

Our off-season weekday afternoon ride, "The Fair Weather Friends", resumed October 2. If you find yourself with some time to ride some Tuesday or Thursday afternoon, come down to Sooner Park and join us for a spin. We meet at 2:00 by the playground.

The weather is always a factor on whether or not the ride goes on. We've not established any hard and fast rules for the weather, but generally, if it is in the mid-40's or warmer, with no precipitation (or threat thereof), we ride. The rides have been being fairly short; around 20-30 miles, but we don't decide where we are going until we are at the park.

# Weekend Rides

**Road Rides:** (Note new departure times)

November – Daylight savings time ends, but ride time remains 8 am from Johnstone Park.

- 3 Wann and vicinity Depending on the weather we can make this 40 55 miles.
- 10 Vera and back If weather holds up we will

- do a round trip of about 58 miles, but you can turn around at Ramona and get about 42 miles.
- 17 Pancakes in Pawhuska Only a few made it to our last trip to Pawhuska. This is a good route when the wind is unpredictable. We now have a new way into town using their bike path. The round trip is about 55 miles from Johnstone Park.
- 24 <u>Barnsdall and Beyond</u> Depending on the weather we may decide to go past Barnsdall to one of the nearby villages. Barnsdall is 44 miles round trip from the Park.

December - With the colder weather ride times will change to 9 am from Johnstone Park. All rides will be tailwind rides.

1 – 31: <u>Tailwind</u> - All rides for December will be tailwind rides leaving Johnstone Park at 9 am. Routes will be chosen based on wind direction and the interests of riders who participate.
